## First Contact Volunteer - Role Details

We are looking for reliable, friendly volunteers to act as the first point of contact for unpaid carers accessing our service.

## **Background:**

Kingston Carers' Network is a charity that supports carers in the Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames. A carer is someone who is providing support, unpaid, to a friend or family member who has a physical illness, disability, mental health problem or substance misuse issue.

At Kingston Carers' Network, we advise carers on a number of issues including benefit entitlement and support, carers rights, services available to carers, wellbeing, and much more.

# How you can help:

As a First Contact Volunteer, you will be the first point of contact for unpaid carers accessing our service. Your help will enable our frontline staff to provide more support to carers.

## **Key tasks:**

- Responding to initial enquiries via the phone, in person and email
- Assisting carers and professionals with information requests
- Taking referrals to our service
- Signposting to other services
- Copying or scanning documents for carers
- Taking in deliveries
- Providing excellent customer care
- Recording and updating carer records on our database

## Time commitment:

- At least one weekday morning per week
- 9:00am 1:00pm

- Once your background checks are complete you will be invited to the office for your induction and training
- You will then have a 4-week trial to see whether the role is right for you
