Volunteer Counsellor - Role Details

Background:

Kingston Carers' Network (KCN) is a charity that supports carers in the Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames. A carer provides unpaid support to a friend or family member who has a physical illness, disability, mental health problem, or substance misuse issue. Our volunteer counselling service offers adult carers twelve, 50-minute counselling sessions, free of charge.

How you can help:

We are looking for volunteers to provide one-to-one counselling sessions to adult carers, at our office: 418 Ewell Road, Tolworth, KT6 7HF.

To be considered you must have a British Association of Counselling and Psychotherapy accredited qualification. We are open to placements for individuals who are in their second year of BA Hons degree-level study (or above); however, we are not able to fund or provide placement hours supervision for diploma students. **You must be able to provide your own supervision.**

Your role:

- To provide weekly counselling for adult carers
- To keep accurate records of client attendance using our scheduling software
- To pass on information to a member of staff at the end of the session if you have any concerns about the person you are counselling
- To refer a carer to the appropriate member of staff if you feel they need additional support or could benefit from our activities or therapies

Time commitment

• To be agreed with Kingston Carers' Network. Usually starting with one client per week, with the potential to go up to as many as four.

We ask that you would:

- Make a regular commitment for a minimum of 6 months
- Undergo an Enhanced DBS (criminal records) check (funded by us)
- Provide your own external supervision
- Although Kingston Carers' Network has insurance cover, we recommend you arrange your own professional indemnity insurance



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Skills needed:

- A BACP accredited counselling qualification or in second year (or above) of BA Hons degree-level study of a BACP accredited course
- Listening skills
- Empathy with client group
- Patience and tact
- · Reliability and punctuality
- Good communicator
- An understanding of confidentiality and boundary issues
- An understanding of carers issues
