Young Carer Activities Volunteer

After-school drop-in

Tuesdays (term time)

3:30pm – 5:30pm

Background:

Kingston Carers' Network (KCN) is a charity that supports unpaid carers in the Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames. Our Young Carers' Project supports children who are caring for a family member who has a physical illness, disability, mental health problem, or substance misuse issue. Our term-time drop-ins give young carers a space to meet, take part in fun activities and seek advice from our support workers.

How you can help:

We are looking for fun and enthusiastic people to lend a hand at our Tuesday after-school drop-in for young carers (aged 5-11). Our activities volunteers play an integral role in helping to facilitate our drop-in sessions, including supporting activities such as cooking, sport, crafts and providing general support for the young people.

Time commitment:

The drop-in takes place every other Tuesday (term time only), 3:30pm – 5:30pm. We ask that you volunteer at least twice a month, on a rota basis, for a period of at least 6 months.

Location:

Busy Bees Soft Play, Chessington Cricket Club, Chessington, KT9 2NB. Parking available.

Possible tasks include:

- Assisting in the delivery of activities
- Assisting with the set up and pack down of session equipment and resources
- Interacting with the young people and encouraging them to engage with the session
- If you have a skill that you think would be beneficial (i.e. sports, craft etc.), let us know!

We ask that you would:

- Carry out Level 1 Child Protection Training (online)
- Participate in additional training as needed
- Undergo an Enhanced DBS (criminal records) check (paid for by us)

Benefits:

- Gain experience working with young people
- Help our young carers to build their confidence and have a break from their caring role
- Meet new people
- Be part of a friendly team

Expenses:

- Your out-of-pocket travel expenses will be reimbursed
- All training is provided free of charge

The qualities and attributes we are looking for:

No formal qualifications are needed, but we will look for some key skills and personal qualities:

- Enthusiasm for working with young people
- Reliable and committed
- Patient
- Non-discriminatory
- A good communicator/listener
- Experience interacting with young people
