





Young Carer Activities Volunteer (Tuesday After-School Club – Term Time) Role Details

Background:

Kingston Carers' Network is a charity that supports carers in the Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames. A carer is someone who is providing support, unpaid, to a friend or family member who has a physical illness, disability, ill mental health or substance misuse issue. Our Young Carers' Project supports carers who are between the ages of 5-18.

How you can help:

We are looking for volunteers to lend a hand at our weekly (term time only) 'drop-ins' for young carers aged 5-11. The drop-ins are an opportunity for young carers to meet together, take part in fun activities and seek advice from our support workers.

Time Commitment:

The drop-in takes place every Tuesday (term time only), 3:30pm – 5:30pm. We ask that you would volunteer at least once a month.

Location:

Busy Bees Soft Play, Chessington Cricket Club, Chessington, KT9 2NB

Possible tasks include:

- Joining in activities
- Encouraging the young people to participate
- Food preparation
- Assisting with set-up and pack-down
- Using your initiative and lending a hand wherever you see help is needed
- Others if you have a skill that you think would be beneficial (i.e. sports, craft etc.), let us know!

We ask that you would:

- Carry out Level 1 Child Protection Training (online)
- Attend training events
- Undergo an Enhanced DBS check

Benefits:

- The opportunity to help our young carers to build their confidence and have a break from their caring role
- Gain experience working with young people
- Ongoing support from the Young Carers' Team and volunteer manager

Expenditure:

Your out-of-pocket travel expenses will be reimbursed.

The qualities and attributes we are looking for:

No formal qualifications are needed, but we will look for some key skills and personal qualities.

- Reliable
- Committed
- Patient
- Non-discriminatory
- A good communicator/listener

What happens next?
